Butyl rubber, BR  
Recommended thickness of the material:  $\geq 0.5$  mm  
The selection of the suitable gloves does not only depend on the material, but also on further marks of quality and varies from manufacturer to manufacturer. As the product is a preparation of several substances, the resistance of the glove material can not be calculated in advance and has therefore to be checked prior to the application.
- **Penetration time of glove material**  
The penetration time has to be at least 60 minutes (Permeation according to EN 374 Part 3: Level 3).  
The exact break through time has to be found out by the manufacturer of the protective gloves and has to be observed.
